**Terms & Conditions:**

1. Flights, transportation, hotels, meals and itinerary stated in the brochure are subject to change without prior notice. Any changes after booking shall be advised accordingly.
2. The sequence of itinerary, meals and hotel arrangements are subject to the final confirmation by the local ground operator.
3. Principally tour commentary will be conducted in Mandarin speaking. However, others languages can be arranged on request basis with surcharge.
4. Due to seasonal change in temperature and weather, most hotels and restaurants have a central control system to regulate the indoor temperature for the comfort of the tour members and the system cannot be adjusted by the tour members.
5. Triple room or extra bed shall be in the form of a roll-in bed or mattress. The room type and category allocated shall depend on the hotel's room availability and arrangement, and is not predetermined by the Company.
6. Purchase of travel insurance is highly advisable. The Company shall not be liable for any losses or personal expenses incurred by the tour members during the tour. Please refer to the insurance policy for the terms of coverage.
7. In the event of adverse weather conditions and/or natural disasters which may lead to traffic delays, extended stays in hotel, cancellation/rescheduling of flights, and/or any other losses, the onus is on the tour members to bear the expenses.
8. Due to adverse weather conditions, traffic congestion, and other unforeseen circumstances, the Company reserves the right to rearrange, change or abandon the tour itinerary without prior notice and there shall not be any reimbursement.
9. Most hotels in Korea do not provide porter services. However, large tour groups shall be accompanied by a junior photographer to provide photography services. The photographs shall be sold before the tour ends at 5000 won/pc (approx. SGD6/pc) to tour members who are interested to purchase. However, there is no obligation to purchase the products sold.
10. All tour members are required to visit the specified COMPULSORY SHOPPING STOPS (minimum 1 hour). However, there is no obligation to purchase the products sold. The Company reserves the right to collect a penalty of SGD300 per person, should tour members refuse to visit the shops or choose to abandon the tour group.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Gyeongbok Palace</b> - Gyeongbok Palace was the main palace during the Joseon Dynasty (1392-1910). It is the most comprehensive and grandest of the five palaces of the Joseon Dynasty. <b>** (Closed on every Tuesday)</b></li> <li>• <b>Gwanghwamun Square</b> - With the inauguration of the square, Sejong-ro, located at the center of the 600-year-old historic city of Seoul, was transformed into a human-centered space that harmonizes with the beautiful scenery of Gyeongbokgung Palace and Bukaksan Mountain.</li> <li>• <b>Jagalchi Market</b> - It is Korea's largest seafood market, and is where you can see the lifestyle of the indigenous Busan natives. It also represents Busan and is famous throughout the country. You may like to try some fresh raw fish right at the market.</li> <li>• <b>Biff Square</b> - This Square was named on 14 August 1996, after the first Busan International Film Festival was held there. In recent years, it has grown into a more complex area, not only movie theaters but also shops and leisure facilities, attracting growing numbers of visitors and tourist.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Yonggungsa Temple</b> - The Southernmost temple near the east sea was founded by the great monk Naong, who was the consultant of King Gongmin.</li> <li>• <b>Songdo Cable Car</b></li> <li>• <b>Gamcheon Cultural Village</b> - Korea's most art-filled town is nestled on top of the hills of Saha-gu in Busan. It is dubbed as the quirkiest art-filled suburb with colourful and narrow alleyways. It attracts thousands of tourists and photography enthusiasts yearly.</li> <li>• <b>Yongdusan Park [INC: Busan Tower Observatory]</b> - Busan Tower is a symbol of Busan that stands proudly 69 m above sea level at a height of 120 m. The top of the tower is modeled after the baldaquin of Dabotap Pagoda in Bulguksa Temple, Gyeongju.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Suncheon Drama Filming Location</b> - This open film set is located in Jorye-dong, Suncheon. It consists of three villages each representing a different era from the 1950s to the 1970s. It has approximately 200 houses and is the largest film set in Korea.</li> <li>• <b>Suncheon Ecological Park</b> - Suncheonman Bay is thickly covered with reeds taller than a full-grown man. It is the biggest colony of reeds in Korea. The image of the entire field swaying in the wind is as dazzling as waves on the sea.</li> <li>• <b>Boseong Green Tea Farm [INC: Green Tea or Ice Cream]</b> - Daehan Dawon Tourist Plantation is an area located in Boseong, and its main specialty is green tea which originated from the mountain valleys south of Boseong. Boseong has been a tea plantation area since the days of the Japanese occupation, and with its long history come large plantations, their traditions, and highly skilled workers.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Damyang Metasequoia Street</b> - Metasequoia trees were planted along the street in the early 1970s when the Ministry of Internal Affairs officially designated the road as a "boulevard."</li> <li>• <b>Damyang Juknokwon</b> - Juknokwon in Damyang is a bamboo forest cultivated by the town of Damyang. Seonginsan Mountain behind Damyang Hyanggyo (Confucian school) was transformed into Juknokwon Bamboo Garden featuring a beautiful artificial waterfall, pavilion, walking paths and an eco-exhibition center</li> <li>• <b>DIY Korean Traditional Sweets</b></li> <li>• <b>Jeonju Hanok Village [INC: Hanbok Wearing]</b> - There are over 800 traditional Korean 'Hanok' houses. It is especially beautiful for its roof curves. The roof edges being slightly raised to the sky is unique.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>The Independence Hall of Korea</b> - Displays Korean historical documents and relics from past to present, mainly focusing on the independence movements of the Japanese Colonial Period to August 15, 1987. <b>** (Closed on every Monday, will be replaced to Oeam Folk Village. )</b></li> <li>• <b>Dongdaemun Market</b> - Head over for Dongdaemun Market, one of the most popular wholesale shopping area in Seoul among Koreans and tourists alike.</li> <li>• <b>Fireman Show</b> - Fireman is a non-verbal performance filled with acrobatic lifts, flips and tricks. It's a dynamic and comical show which is recommended for anyone who enjoys watching performance shows. The story is about how trainees go through a harsh, strenuous training and develop their vigor to become actual Fireman.</li> </ul>
